## Dear volunteers,

This infopack will answer most of the important questions about the ESC project, your tasks as a volunteer, your host association ASED and your host country Tunisia.

**Volunteering** is definied as an unpaid activity where someone gives their time to help a non-profit organisation or an individual whom they are not related to. One of the better-know benefits of volunteering is the impact on the community.

## **Accommodation:**

You will live together with other volunteers in an apartment in Tantana, Chott Meriem. It's a touristic area with restaurants, cafes and shops. The apartment is close to the sea, it's approximately a 5 minute-walk. It consists of 3 bedrooms, a living room with a kitchenette, a bathroom and a huge terrace.













#### Rules of accommodation:

- It's forbidden to invite people to the house.
- The volunteer has to economize the electricity because it is so expensive in that area.
- The volunteer has to keep the house clean.
- The volunteer must keep the host organisation informed about his/her whereabouts during the period of service. For any personal travel, friends, family visit, excursions... anywhere in Tunisia during working and free days, the volunteer must inform his/her mentor and the president of ASED and ask for his/her approval.
- The volunteer must attend all activities specified in his/her weekly schedule and the events organized by the association. If the volunteer, for any reason, cannot attend any of the activities, he/she must inform his/her mentor or president in advance and specify the reasons.
- The volunteer must respect the personnel of the host organization and partner associations and NGO hosting his/her project.
- The volunteer is not allowed to take part in any other activity especially demonstrations or strikes organized by other associations (for political reason).

## **Transport:**

There are many means of transport in Tunisia - trains, buses, taxis, and louage. Louage is a yellow or white taxi for 8 passengers. Yellow ones drive mainly on specific routes in cities, whereas white ones are longdistance. Keep in mind that in Tunisia all rules are flexible, so sometimes you will see white louage in the city and yellow louage on the highway. In every city, the louages have their own specific stops and routes. There are three busiest and most important stops in Sousse. Bab Bhar, located near the Medina walls in the city center, Menchia in Hammam Sousse and Tafela, located on the outskirts of the city - from this station you can find louage to other cities.

You can catch Louage almost anywhere!

The rule is simple - you can stop louage wherever you want and join to the rest of the passengers. When you want to get off, say Ca va. The price list is fixed in advance, but when moving around the city, the cost of one trip is about one dinar.

The undoubted advantage is that they are cheap and very fast.




Tantana - El Kantaoui 750 millim Tantana - Menchia (Hammam Sousse) 750 millim

## **Prices:**

Those are fixed prices of the routes that you will use. Soviva, Tantana - Sousse, Bab Bhar 1 dinar (1000 millim) If you want to go to Sousse, you should catch the louage from the roundabout next to the Soviva Hotel. Also, if you go from Sousse to Tantana, you should tell the driver that you want to get off at Soviva, so you will pay just 1 dinar. The thing is that Soviva belongs to the El Kantaoui zone, so the price is lower.



The two most important louage stops are marked on the map at the top.

Your activities will take place in Akouda, Kala Seghira, Kantaoui, Sousse Centre (map on the right)



# Where to shop in Tantana and Sousse?

You will find many small shops in your area where you can buy most of the products. Below you will find the names of the big cheap shops and markets (souks) in Sousse.

## Big shops:

Monoprix Hammam Sousse
Aziza on the way to Hergla
Carrefour in Khzema (between Hammam
Sousse and Sousse)
Carrefour in Mall of Sousse

## Souks

At souks you can buy almost everything, especially cheap and fresh fruits and vegetables and afoordable second-hand clothes. It's always better to go in the early morning to have a greater choice. Souk Lahad (Sunday's souk) in Sousse near Tafala.





All volunteers receive monthly money from the host organization and they are free to spend it as they wish.

200 dinars for food

**40 dinars** for transport to go to the activities in Akouda, Kala Sghira, Sousse Center, Kantaoui

You will also receive **pocket money - around 90EUR** per month but it depends on your country and the sending organization that deals with it.

# Cigna insurance:

It must be done by your sending organisation before you come to Tunisia. You must have an insurance card printed in two copies, one for you and the other for our organization.

## **Certification:**

At the end of your ESC (short/long term) you will receive a youth pass.

# Your location

Your accommodation is situated in Tantana, a touristic district of Sousse near the beach. It is 15 km from the center of Sousse, but it is an easy and cheap commute. Sousse is a touristic city on the eastern coast of Tunisia. It is the third biggest city in Tunisia but it's still relatively small with the population of 270 000.

Tourists are attracted to Sousse by its beautiful beaches, nice weather, seaside resorts, luxurious yacht port El Kantaoui and the old town with its sights from the 9th century.





You will have a unique opportunity to learn a new language: the Tunisian dialect.

The official language in Tunisia is Arabic. However, in daily life Tunisian people use their dialect, which is a bit different from the Standard Arabic.

While in Tunisia, you will be able to communicate with people in English or French, and you will have a language lesson once a week where you can learn Tunisian.

You need to know that exploring Tunisia is also very cheap and if you feel like it, in your free time, you can check out some interesting places to get to know this country and its culture better.

## Here are some suggestions:)

#### Monastir

Beautiful town situated by the sea 40 km from Sousse. Places worth seeing:


- Medina
- Ribat
- Mausoleum of Bourguiba
- Marina

How to get there:

You need to take a louage from Soviva roundabout to Sousse - 1 dinar and next metro to Monastir - 1 dinar.







#### Hergla

Lovely, small fishing town close to your neighborhood. How to get there:

You need to take a louage from your apartment directly to Hergla - 1 dinar





#### **Takruna**

Small Berber village located on a hill 200 meters above the sea. There is a great cafe at the top with an amazing view from the windows and the terrace. Next to the cafe there is a small museum dedicated to the history of Takruna and its inhabitants.

How to get there:

You need to take a louage from Soviva roundabout to the Menshia stop in Hammam Sousse, next another louage to the town of Enfidha, then from there you should take the next louage directly to Takruna. One-way travel cost is 4 dinars.









#### El Jam

Small town in the west of Tunisia, an hour-drive south of Sousse.

It is known for its world-famous Roman Amphitheater of El Jam. After visiting the theatre you need to go to the famous museum of mosaics. It contains the impressive collection of exquisitely-preserved and impressively meticulous Roman mosaics.

How to get there:

You need to take a louage from Soviva roundabout to the Menshia stop in Hammam Sousse, next another louage to Tafela station, then from there you should take the next louage directly to El Jam.


One way travel cost is 8 dinars.







## 3 days on Sahara



#### **Tunis**

Capital city of Tunisia. It's the biggest city in Tunisia, so it's worth going there for 3 days. How to get there:

You need to take a louage from Soviva roundabout to the Menshia stop in Hammam Sousse, then from there another louage to Tafela station and then from there you should take the next louage directly to Tunis.

One way travel cost is 15 dinars.

Our volunteers from Poland and Turkey stayed at the Le Calife Hotel.

Cost per night 25 dinars per person.

To reach places far from the city centre you can use metro, for example:

Sidi Bou Said - 700 milim

Carthage - 700 milim

Museum Bardo - 500 milim
